Message From The President

Dear Cornell Black Alumni Association Members and Friends,

This past year CBAA held social and volunteer activities for our membership and other African American Alumni to keep in touch and give back to Cornell. Highlights were the December 2007, Alvin Ailey Dance Theater Event (a fundraiser for CBAA Scholarships), our November 2007, General Body Meeting at the National Urban League Headquarters in New York City, and the Winter Break Receptions for current Cornell students held in DC, NYC and Atlanta in January. What a year!

If you celebrated our 30th Anniversary at CBAA's Update 2006 Reunion, I am sure you are looking forward to attending Update 2009 on June 4-7, 2009. Attendance records will likely be broken as newer graduates join us in the educational seminars, alumni-faculty interactions, and unique social events. A message from our Reunion Co-Chairs, Deborah Arrindell '79 and Donell Hicks '97, is on the reverse side of this letter.

This presidential election year and the important foreign and domestic issues at stake bring home the value of higher education and the need for voluntarism. CBAA needs you to get involved in organizing activities and displaying the leadership qualities that will enable you to advance CBAA's mission. The next election of CBAA officers will be held at our June 2009 reunion.

CBAA's mission remains "to share the vision of our education." We continue to urge Cornell, through our voices and monetary support, to strengthen and expand opportunities for Black students, an "underrepresented minority" at Cornell. CBAA scholarships play a vital role in helping students afford the over \$50,000 cost of a Cornell education. Sizeable and annual donations are needed to ensure the longevity and vitality of CBAA Tradition Fellowships as well as the Africana Studies and Research Center (AS&RC) programming. Donors to the AS&RC Fund will be listed on a plaque at the Africana Center, memorializing CBAA's commitment for posterity.

Reunion classes and organizations typically mark their return to Cornell with a tangible gift to support the multi-faceted Cornell experience. While our newsletter annually reaches over 3,600 Black Alumni, only a few of you have answered past appeals to donate to Cornell and to play an active role in her future. We hope to help deserving students continue their education by raising \$450,000 by reunion. We specifically challenge our over 290 CBAA Life Members to donate \$1,000 or more each to help meet this goal.

The scholarship committee is planning a spring fundraiser. In the meantime, **you can make a tax-deductible donation by making your check payable to Cornell University and mail it with the enclosed form.** You can also donate on line through our website (which links you to Cornell's website). **Please make checks payable to "CBAA" for CBAA dues only.**

Become an active CBAA member, donate regularly to Cornell, and help improve the lives of young people. Members are needed to serve as Regional Representatives in Boston, California, DC, and Greater New York, and to serve on the Fundraising, Scholarship, Programming, Reunion, and Student Relations Committees. CBAA Tradition Fellowships/Scholarships

CBAA has two endowed scholarship funds, the Cornell Black Alumni Association Tradition Fellowship, which totals over \$400,000 and the John Henrik Clarke Tradition Fellowship, which totals over \$250,000 and honors the esteemed Historian and former AS&RC Professor. Currently, six students receive CBAA Scholarships in amounts of \$4,000 or less, barely as dent in the cost of a Cornell education which ranges from **\$34,000 to \$50,000 this year.**

Cornell Teams Have Historic Year

The 2007-2008 intercollegiate season will be remembered for both our men's and women's basketball teams winning the Ivy League title and advancing to the NCAA Championships. For the first time in Ivy League history, men's and women's teams from the same school qualified for the NCAA tournament. It was Women's Basketball first ever appearance in the tourney and Men's Basketball 2nd Ivy championship since the inception of the Ivy League in 1956. Other notable titles include the Women's Outdoor Track & Field (7th consecutive HEPS/Ivy title), Men's Outdoor Track & Field (6th consecutive HEPS/Ivy title), and the Men's Indoor Track & Field (4th HEPS/Ivy title in 6 years). President Skorton Affirms Commitment to Need-Based Financial Aid and to Increased Fundraising for Undergraduate Scholarships

In a October 17, 2008, State of the University address largely devoted to a report on Cornell's financial stability and the need to preserve and protect the university's future, Cornell President, David Skorton, pledged that Cornell "cannot and will not retreat from our long-standing commitment to need-based student financial aid."

President Skorton committed to raising an additional \$125 million for undergraduate financial aid, and he asked for the support of alumni. "By increasing our campaign goal for undergraduate scholarships from \$225 million to \$350 million, we can ensure that students have the freedom to pursue their academics dreams," he said. "I realize that this is one of several priorities in the Far Above campaign, but it is the one that, with your help, I intend to make a hallmark of my presidency." Cornell Drops Need-Based Loans for Students from Families Earning under \$75,000

Building on a long history of need-blind admissions and need-based aid, Cornell announced a new financial aid initiative, starting in 2008-09, to eliminate need-based loans for all undergraduate students from families with income under \$75,000, making it possible for new students to graduate debt-free.

Cornell's new financial aid initiative will be implemented over two years. In the first year, 2008-09, the university will eliminate need-based loans going forward for undergraduate students from families with incomes under \$60,000, and cap them annually at \$3,000 for students from families with incomes between \$60,000 and \$120,000. In 2009-10, the program will take full effect by eliminating need-based loans for students from families with incomes up to \$75,000, and capping annual loans at \$3,000 for students from families with income between \$75,000 and \$120,000.

Deputy Provost David Harris stated, "Because Cornell's financial-aid population is larger than the entire undergraduate student bodies of a number of our fellow institutions, the challenge was especially significant here. This initiative will strengthen the economic diversity of our student body and, most importantly, free our students to pursue studies and careers that match their skills and interests, rather than those that ensure they will be able to repay their loans."

At the time of its founding, Cornell University was considered revolutionary because its founder, Ezra Cornell, was committed to access for all students, regardless of economic circumstance, race and gender, declaring, "I would found an institution where any person can find instruction in any study." Together with Cornell's first president, Andrew Dickson White, he opened the institution's doors "to applicants for admission ... at the lowest rates of expense consistent with its welfare and efficiency, and without distinction as to rank, class, previous occupation or locality." Within the first 10 years of operation, the university admitted women and underrepresented minority students and provided financial aid for many students, using a combination of grant, loan and work-study opportunities. The university awarded need-based grants as early as 1879, and its first endowed scholarship fund was created in 1892.

CBAA's 2008 Outstanding Senior Service Award

Enongo Lumumba-Kasongo, Arts '08, is the most recent recipient of CBAA's Outstanding Senior Service Award. The award recognizes the efforts of a graduating senior of African descent for his or her outstanding leadership and service in enhancing the lives of students and the community-at-large while attending Cornell University. Enongo embodied such leadership qualities and social consciousness and was awarded \$500 and a certificate honoring her achievement at the Office of Minority Affairs Senior Awards Banquet last May of 2008.

Enongo and her family reside in Ithaca, New York. At Cornell, she majored in Science and Technology Studies and Sociology. While there she was the Co-President of Black Students United, an umbrella organization for the roughly 40 black student groups at the University, and she led a number of different initiatives, including the outstanding effort to raise \$22,000 for a weeklong Katrina relief initiative. In addition, Enongo was also involved in raising scholarship funds for students at both Ithaca High School and Cornell who have demonstrated exceptional leadership, academic achievement, and a commitment to community service.

Enongo believes that the skills she has developed at Cornell will enable her to strengthen the connection between current students and alumni. CBAA congratulates Enongo on her achievement and success at Cornell, and expects great things from her in the future.
